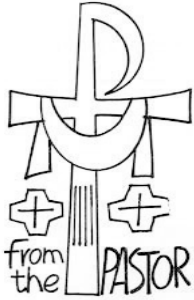
**Veterans Ministry Patriotic Rosary**

Dear friends,

This week, as I so often do, I write about some exciting things that are happening in our parishes.



**Sunday Evening Mass at St. Philip** — On **Sunday, 20 November, at 5:00pm at St. Philip Church, we will celebrate a Mass.** In my years as a priest, I have seen how increasingly difficult it is for families with children in grammar school or high school to balance social activities such as sports with their participation in the worship life of their faith communities. I know well that many St. Philip and St. Mary families find themselves, for example, at the 6:30pm Mass on Sunday night at St. Luke parish in Westborough. Today, society pressures families to sacrifice some of what the Lord's Day should be. Some would say that adding more Masses to an already generous schedule is a concession to this. However, we want to offer an option which will help families find a balance.

That's why we're trying this experiment: to offer a 5:00pm Mass once a month on a Sunday night, starting with 20 November. We invite everyone and all families to make Sunday worship easier for them—especially those with children in religious education program at 6:00pm on Sundays at St. Philip.

The Mass will include religious education students serving in liturgical roles such as lecturing. And St. Philip's new Music Director Jonathan Capace is bringing in a contemporary praise and worship music ensemble called "4U". And although they play liturgical music different from the more traditional, they will not be playing the more extreme Christian rock music which, for example, we hear in Life Teen Masses.

**Upcoming Message Series** — Two weeks ago, we finished a four week Message Series called "Why Am I Catholic?" Many of you commented on how you were enriched by the message, and over 50 people from both parishes continued the discussion during the weeks which followed the homilies in six Small Groups. I joined several sessions and participated in the power of a group of disciples sharing and exploring the richness of our life in Christ.

Our next Message Series is coming up fast. Beginning the 1st Sunday of Advent, November 26-27, "St. Mother Theresa of Calcutta: A Light in Darkness", will begin. It is about the life, vocation, ministry and struggles of Mother Theresa. She brought the Light of Christ to what she called "the dark holes" (abodes) of the poorest of the poor in Calcutta. Many people have expressed enthusiasm about the series, and you will have the opportunity to sign up in the Gathering Space or church entrance on the weekends of November 12-13 and 19-20. More details about meeting times and places will be in upcoming bulletins.



**Update on Viridian, Our Parishes' (and Your?) Electricity Provider** — Earlier this year, both parishes started to use Viridian as their energy provider and became Viridian associates so that parishioners could enjoy the same cost-saving and green-promoting benefits while helping their parish save money. The response, in all candor, has been modest: St. Mary has 22 electric meters signed up, and St. Philip has 8. This means that, every month, St. Mary saves \$44.00 off its electric bill, which is about \$650.00 a month, and St. Philip saves \$16.00 off its bill, which is about \$275.00 a month.

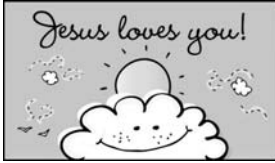
**So here is a thought: Wouldn't it be great if we signed up enough people to wipe out both electric bills? That means that if we get 300 more people to sign up through St. Mary, and 130 more people to sign up through St. Philip, then we will meet this goal.** Can we make this a goal? Can we reconsider what a win/win situation this is for the parishes and you. Let's ask ourselves, do we like to pay more in taxes than we owe? Do we search out the most expensive gas station? Then why would we want to pay more for brown energy which creates CO2? I know the town is preparing to put everyone on a green energy plan, but why would we want to wait for a deal which isn't as good as Viridian's and which doesn't help the parish? Right now, you can choose a source which is at least 60% green, renewable energy from wind, solar or water AND less than what National Grid is charging.

**Question 4 on Mass Ballot** — Last weekend's bulletin included a message from Bishop Mc Manus and an insert from all the Massachusetts Bishops which addressed Question 4 on the Massachusetts State Ballot for this upcoming election. As in many other states, we will be deciding whether to make legal the recreational use of marijuana. The Bishops pointed out that our society battles the devastating opioid crisis which each day claims the lives of those who have been snared in the trap of addiction. They also said that it is troubling that we would legalize a gateway drug that, in addition to its own damaging effects, has led far too many users to be destroyed by the use of opioids.

It is notable that Governor Baker, District Attorney Joseph Early and the School Committee of the City of Worcester all strongly oppose the legalization of marijuana, with particular recognition of the harm such an action would bring to children and young people. Copies of the bulletin insert from the Bishops which has more information are available at the church exits.

**Market Sunday's Outreach Program "Neighbor Helping Neighbor"** is set up by our St. Vincent de Paul and Market Sunday ministries to communicate with our parishioners on seasonal food items that would help to broaden our food pantry. The items being requested are: Soup (all varieties are welcome, especially meat-based soups), cereal that adults would prefer (Special K, Raisin Bran, etc), cookies that adults would prefer (tea biscuits, ginger snaps, Fig Newtons, etc.), canned coffee, tea, hot chocolate, canned carrots and corn, rice pilaf, rice, rice mixes, Hamburger Helper, Lipton Side Dishes, salad dressing, mayonnaise (small jars), pancake mix and maple syrup, laundry detergent. Please remember this is only a suggested guideline; any and all items are appreciated. Food items can be left in the Gathering Space at St. Mary on the Market Sunday food cart, downstairs on the cart located by the food cabinets, or on the table to the left of the cabinets. At St. Philip, you may leave them in the basket marked SVDP located at the entrance of the church. We are blessed to have the generous parish families of St. Mary and St. Philip and very grateful for all the food you donate.
