33rd Sunday in Ordinary

Dear friends,



This week, as I so often do, I write about some exciting things that are happening in our parishes.

Sunday Evening Mass at St. Philip — On Sunday, 20 November, at 5:00pm at St. Philip Church, we will celebrate a Mass. In my years as a priest, I have seen how increasingly difficult it is for families with children in grammar school or high school to balance social activities such as sports with their participation in the worship life of their faith communities. I know well that many St. Philip and St. Mary families find themselves, for example, at the 6:30pm Mass on Sunday night at St. Luke parish in Westborough. Today, society pressures families to sacrifice some of what the Lord's Day should be. Some would say that adding more Masses to an already generous schedule is a concession to this. However, we want to offer an option which will help families find a balance.

That's why we're trying this experiment: to offer a 5:00pm Mass once a month on a Sunday night, starting with 20 November. We invite everyone and all families to make Sunday worship easier for them—especially those with children in religious education program at 6:00pm on Sundays at St. Philip.

The Mass will include religious education students serving in liturgical roles such as lecturing. And St. Philip's new Music Director Jonathan Capace is bringing in a contemporary praise and worship music ensemble called "4U". And although they play liturgical music different from the more traditional, they will not be playing the more extreme Christian rock music which, for example, we hear in Life Teen Masses.

Upcoming Message Series — Two weeks ago, we finished a four week Message Series called "Why Am I Catholic?" Many of you commented on how you were enriched by the message, and over 50 people from both parishes continued the discussion during the weeks which followed the homilies in six Small Groups. I joined several sessions and participated in the power of a group of disciples sharing and exploring the richness of our life in Christ.



Our next Message Series is coming up fast. Beginning the 1st Sunday of Advent, November 26-27, "St. Mother Theresa of Calcutta: A Light in Darkness", will begin. It is about the life, vocation, ministry and struggles of Mother Theresa. She brought the Light of Christ to what she called "the dark holes" (abodes) of the poorest of the poor in Calcutta. Many people have expressed enthusiasm about the series, and you will have the opportunity to sign up in the Gathering Space or church entrance on the weekends of November 12-13 and 19-20. The primary source for the material for this series is a book of Mother Theresa's correspondence called "Come Be My Light". More details about meeting times and places will be in upcoming bulletins.



My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

In a visit to Central America in 2015, Pope Francis cited St. Paul when he said, "As Christians, we have an additional reason to love and serve the poor; for in them we see the face and the flesh of Christ, who made himself poor so to enrich us with his poverty." With these words, Pope Francis continues to bring our attention back to the poor and our responsibility toward our brothers and sisters "on the margins." The Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) responds directly to this call by addressing the root causes of poverty in the United States.

Often, when juveniles are arrested their record follows them their whole lives, decreasing their chances of finding gainful employment and increasing their chances of reoffending. Together with the Catholic bishops, groups like the Direct Action and Research Training Center (DART) in Miami are working to reduce the number of juvenile arrests, giving children a real chance at success. Thanks to a strategic national grant from CCHD, DART is working with school and law enforcement officials to decrease the number of school-based arrests and promote alternative, constructive interventions that give children a second chance at their future.

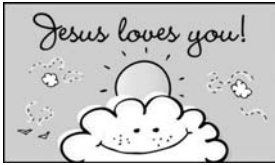
This collection is the primary source of funding for CCHD's anti-poverty grants and education programs, like the grant that supports DART. And remember, 25 percent of the collection stays here in our diocese. This past October, I once again had the privilege of meeting with our parish and community groups who receive the local grants from this campaign. It is always inspiring to me to see how these small seeds grow into fruitful programs to support the dignity of people often on the margins of our communities.

Please help the efforts of CCHD to break the cycle of poverty. Fight poverty in America. Support CCHD in our diocesan collection on November 19 & 20. For more information about the Collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development and the groups it funds, please visit www.povertyusa.org.

St. Mary's 2016 Financial Report and 2017 Budget

Last June we published a midterm 2016 Financial Report. This report discusses the full 2016 fiscal year which ended 31 August 2016 and our proposed 2017 budget.

In June we explained that our financial condition was good. Due to your continued support, a mild 2015-2016 winter and large one-time donations and special gifts we were able to successfully close the 2016 year on 31 August. For 2017, however, we cannot plan on mild winters and generous one-time gifts, so our 2017 budget reflects our anticipated expenses and income based on prior year experience.

Our projected 2017 income will be approximately \$580,000, which is similar to 2014, three years ago. Our 2017 expenses will be approximately \$593,000, which is less than a 1% increase over the same 3 year period. Our income has not kept up with our minimal expense increase. We will continue to implement cost savings in our daily operations and then meet our financial obligations by accessing our \$47,000 DEF operating savings account which is not restricted by gift giver requests. (Note: When you provide a gift for a specific project those funds are restricted for the stated purpose and not available to cover operating costs). A strategy to cover our operating costs from our savings without a plan to replenish the account is a strategy with a predictable failure point in the near future. We'll keep you updated.

It would be wonderful if we could discuss the parish's financial condition and not ask for more money from you, our parish family. Our message has been and continues to be consistent. **We recognize and appreciate your contributions but need to again ask you to discern prayerfully your weekly or monthly donation to our church. If you could increase your donation it will make a significant impact. Next weekend during all the Masses, we will again have an opportunity to fill in anonymous Commitment Cards and put them in a receptacle to be placed in front the statue of our patroness, the Blessed Virgin Mary, as an outward sign of our deliberate weekly or monthly stewardship. If you have already increased your offering to the parish we again thank you for that generosity and continued support.**

As always, your continuing generosity of your treasure as a sacrifice to God and His people is cherished. We consider it a sacred trust to be the stewards of your stewardship. Update on Viridian, Our Parishes' (and Your?) Electricity Provider — Earlier this year, both parishes started to use Viridian as their energy provider and became Viridian associates so that parishioners could enjoy the same cost-saving and green-promoting benefits while helping their parish save money. The response, in all candor, has been modest: St. Mary has 22 electric meters signed up, and St. Philip has 8. This means that , every month, St. Mary saves \$44.00 off its electric bill, which is about \$650.00 a month, and St. Philip saves \$16.00 off its bill, which is about \$275.00 a month. So here is a thought: Wouldn't it be great if we signed up enough people to wipe out both electric bills? That means that if we get 300 more people to sign up through St. Mary, and 130 more people to sign up through St. Philip, then we will meet this goal. Can we make this a goal? Can we reconsider what a win/win situation this is for the parishes and you. Let's ask ourselves, do we like to pay more in taxes than we owe? Do we search out the most expensive gas station? Then why would we want to pay more for brown energy which creates CO2? I know the town is preparing to put everyone on a green energy plan, but why would we want to wait for a deal which isn't as good as Viridian's and which doesn't help the parish? Right now, you can choose a source which is at least 60% green, renewable energy from wind, solar or water AND less than what National Grid is charging.
