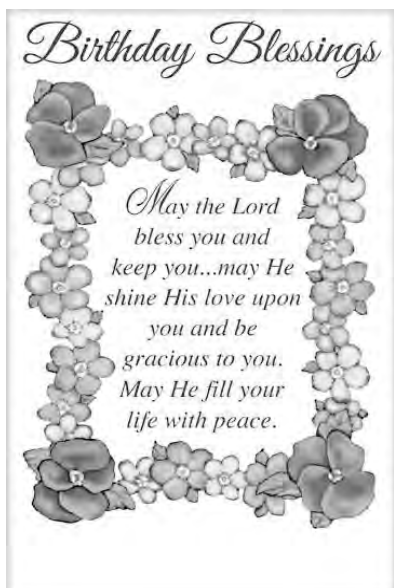

Dear friends,

This week, I write (as I do from time-to-time) about a miscellany of things happening (or upcoming) in the parishes.

**Lenten Message Series/Small Groups Sign-up**

First we will have a new Message Series during Lent. Before I describe it, let me thank all of you who filled out the survey we had last fall about the Inspire (formerly called Rebuilt) initiatives, such as Message Series during the homilies, Small Faith-sharing Groups, the Contemporary Music and the Nurse-Care. In all honesty, we didn't learn anything revolutionary, but you did tell us that you appreciate the efforts enough for us to continue with them.

The latest Message Series will run through the first five Sundays of Lent (are longest series yet). At the beginning of this year, from the altar and in the bulletin, I mentioned that I felt inspired to declare, at least unofficially, 2017 to be The Year of the Eucharist in our parishes. I wasn't sure what that meant at the time (and am still not), but I do feel moved to develop a series on the Eucharist, which is called **The Eucharist: God's Inexhaustible Gift**. The topics are:

- 1st Sunday of Lent: Soul Food for the Long Haul
- 2nd Sunday of Lent: Life (Eternal) Is a Banquet
- 3rd Sunday of Lent: Every Body Needs Blood
- 4th Sunday of Lent: He Is Really Here!
- 5th Sunday of Lent: His Life for Ours: The Holy Sacrifice

We will be having sign-ups for Small Groups for this series on the weekends of February 18-19 and February 25-26.

**Food for the Poor Priest Coming** — On the weekend of February 18-19, while I am away on vacation, we will be having another priest from Food for the Poor, Fr. Brad Smith from Jamaica, coming to share with us how we can help with their mission to provide direct relief to the poor throughout Latin America and the Caribbean. He will give his personal witness about Food for the Poor's mission to care for the destitute as a way to live the Gospel's mandate to love one another. Please welcome him warmly and show him your generosity, as you do unflinchingly. Thank you in advance.

**Greeter Ministry Reboot** — One of the important ministries in St. Mary parish really needs a revival. After I came to Grafton, I helped institute the Greeter Ministry to try to make St. Mary an even more welcoming and hospitable faith community. Having individuals or families at the entrances of the church to smile, greet and answer questions for parishioners (and prospective parishioners) before and after Masses is an invaluable asset. This ministry started with enthusiasm and success. This was a blessing because one of the best ways to gather the people of God into His house is to have a thriving Greeter Ministry. However, the ministry underwent several turnovers in leadership for reasons such as people moving from the area. Unfortunately, and primarily because of my lack of attention and energy, the ministry has waned to the point where it really needs to be rebuilt again from the ground up. Please, if you think you're hearing the voice of God calling you to this ministry, answer it by talking to me about it. Thank you for your consideration.

**Decorating Ministry** — Another important role which we need to fill in another crucial ministry at St. Mary is to find a new coordinator for decorating the church, especially with flowers at Easter and Christmas. Nobody signs up for a ministry for life (although we would like her to), so after many wonderful years of doing a fabulous job, Judy Crespo is stepping down. These are big shoes to fill, but if you love flowers, have a knack for decorating and think God is calling you to lead this ministry, please talk to me. On behalf of the entire parish, I thank Judy for using her gifts in loving service to the parish in this ministry.

**January Stewardship Ministry Intention** — January is a month in which traditionally we pray for Christian unity. It is Jesus', the Good Shepherd's, desire that there be "one Shepherd, one flock". (John 10:16) We are brothers and sisters through God the Father's desire to reconcile the world to His beloved Son, Jesus Christ. We recall that Jesus died for all people: past, present and future. Through His death and resurrection we are invited to live united in His love and compassion, and so we pray:

*God our Father, we pray as one, just as the Lord Jesus prayed we may be one, in Him. Through His love and compassion He compels us to be reconciled to each other, to Him and to you. Grant that our spirits be joined to your Holy Spirit, that we may witness to the visible unity of your Church. May we all recognize that we are truly one with you, Father, Son and Holy Spirit and grow together in peace. We ask this through Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever, Amen.*

The retreat will take place **on Saturday March 4th from 10 am to 3pm**. Please sign up with Mrs. LeBlanc.

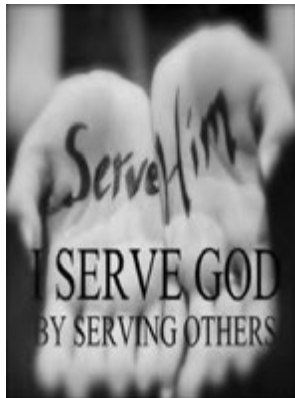
