2nd Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday)

Dear friends,



Next weekend we kick-off our participation in our Diocese's annual Partners in Charity Appeal with our in-pew solicitation. You may well know that the rest of the Diocese started this over a month ago, so you may be asking, "Why so late, Father? Don't we care about the Appeal?" It is precisely because we care so much that we are starting late. Let me explain. When I saw when the kick-off was scheduled, I said, "Well, that falls right in the middle of our Lenten Message Series on the Eucharist. And when the series ends, it will be Palm Sunday, and then Easter, and then Divine Mercy Sunday". I did not want to try to squeeze an important message about Partners in Charity in with these other critical messages and celebrations. So, I asked the Bishop personally face-to-face if we could have permission to start our campaign a month late, assuring him that it would result in more generous giving from the parishioners of St. Mary and St. Philip. He agreed.

The annual Appeal is such a powerful means for us to share the gifts God has bestowed on us with our Catholic Community here in Worcester County. This allows us to live our faith, help build God's kingdom and assist so many of Jesus' brothers and sisters with their various needs. Our generosity and stewardship help fund the work of 29 charitable, educational and pastoral ministries and help thousands of families through outreach, formation, evangelization and worship, including:

- Families which need a helping hand through Catholic Charities and Pernet Family Health Services
- Seminarians studying for the priesthood and candidates studying to be deacons to spend their lives helping and serving us
- Retired priests whom we can help after a lifetime of helping and serving us
- Catholic school students who otherwise could not fulfill their God-given potential with the benefit of a Catholic education
- Orphan boys who would not grow into the men God created them to be by living, working and studying at the McAuley Nazareth Home for Boys
- Pre-born children who have a right to life and their parents who are struggling to choose life with the benefit of the Respect Life Office
- Our Catholic brothers and sisters who struggle for the basic necessities of life in the Diocese of Les Cayes, Haiti, the poorest and most tortured country in the Western Hemisphere
- Our African and Latino Catholic brothers and sisters who are trying to assimilate into our culture with the benefit of worshipping in their own language with priests and religious who speak it and understand their culture of origin

**DIVINE MERCY SERVICE TODAY**

As we do every year, **we will have a service at St. Mary church on Divine Mercy Sunday, TODAY, from 2:00 to 4:00pm.** This column explains why we should participate. To do so, we go back to the 1930s in Poland, where Jesus appeared in visions to St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, a Sister of Our Lady of Mercy. He communicated to her His desire to pour out His mercy and promote greater trust in Him.

The gifts Jesus gave to help us receive His Divine Mercy include the image He asked St. Faustina to have painted according to His design, a copy of which hangs in St. Mary Church between the pulpit and the tabernacle. The image shows Jesus' hand touching His chest, from which two rays shine forth—one white, one red—to remind us of the water and blood which flowed from His side on the Cross after a soldier's lance pierced His dead body. The Church has always seen this as a sign that Christ was pouring out His grace on

the world through the Sacraments of Baptism (water) and Eucharist (the Precious Blood). The Lord told Faustina that He would pour out great graces on all who honor and pray with the image, at the bottom of which are the words "Jesus, I trust in you".

Another gift He gave is the Divine Mercy Chaplet, a simple yet powerful prayer recited using rosary beads which takes no longer than ten minutes and about which Jesus said, "... by saying the Chaplet you are bringing human-kind closer to Me", and, "The souls that say this Chaplet will be embraced by My Mercy during their lifetime and especially at the hour of their death". Each year there is a novena of the Divine Mercy which includes praying the Chaplet from Good Friday through Divine Mercy Sunday. Pamphlets which include the novena prayers and instructions on praying the Chaplet are available in the church this weekend.

The celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday on the Second Sunday of Easter was itself specified by our Lord to St. Faustina: "I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially poor sinners ... whoever approaches the Fount of Life on this day will be granted complete remission of sins and punishment". This is why St. Pope John Paul II, on 30 April 2000, promulgated Divine Mercy Sunday and declared Sr. Faustina a saint. (John Paul himself was canonized a saint on Divine Mercy Sunday in 2014.) While Jesus' talk about "remission of sins and punishment" sounds harsh, it is really loving. When we sin we need not only to seek forgiveness, but also to heal from our self-inflicted wounds. The healing can be trying at times, as with physical wounds, but Jesus wants us to be perfectly whole. That's why a priest gives penitents a penance as part of the Sacrament of Reconciliation: we are completely forgiven of the sins we confess, but we still need spiritual medicine to heal. The Lord is so merciful that He allows this healing process to continue after death if necessary. We call this process Purgatory. However, Divine Mercy Sunday gives us a chance to heal now.

That's why Divine Mercy Sunday includes celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation and receiving the Eucharist worthily with the intention of obtaining what's called a plenary indulgence. This means we ask for and receive a superabundance of God's healing mercy: we are healed completely and continue our spiritual journey with an absolutely fresh start. A number of priests are joining us on Divine Mercy Sunday to help celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation while we adore Jesus in the Eucharist and pray. The service will also include Scripture reading, a reflection, the rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet and more. Please consider our Lord's invitation to drink deeply from the fount of His mercy.
