7th Sunday of Easter



Dear friends,

On this Memorial Day weekend, our thoughts and prayers are with the veterans of our armed forces who have made the ultimate sacrifice and laid down their lives protecting our nation's freedoms. Truly, these people made what Jesus says is the ultimate act of love: to lay down one's life for another. We have many people in our armed forces today who are prepared to do that, some of whom are parishioners in our parishes. We owe all of them our immense gratitude. Nothing brings home to me more powerfully the depths of the sacrifice so many have made as what I shared on Good Friday a few weeks ago. I, like so many, encountered it decades ago when we watched documentary filmmaker Ken Burns' series on the Civil War. It's a letter which a Union officer, Major Sullivan Ballou, wrote to his wife Sarah. As his regiment prepared to fight the first battle of Bull Run, he wrote the letter which indicated that he had a strong sense that he would not survive the battle. Below is the portion I read during my Good Friday homily:

July 14, 1861  
Camp Clark, Washington DC

Dear Sarah:

*The indications are very strong that we shall move in a few days – perhaps tomorrow. And lest I should not be able to write you again I feel impelled to write a few lines that may fall under your eye when I am no more.*

*I have no misgivings about, or lack of confidence in the cause in which I am engaged, and my courage does not halt or falter. I know how American Civilization now leans upon the triumph of the government and how great a debt we owe to those who went before us through the blood and suffering of the Revolution. And I am willing – perfectly willing – to lay down all my joys in this life, to help maintain this government, and to pay that debt.*

*Sarah, my love for you is deathless, it seems to bind me with mighty cables that nothing but omnipotence can break; and yet my love of Country comes over me like a strong wind and bears me irresistibly with all those chains to the battlefield. The memory of all the blissful moments I have enjoyed with you come crowding over me, and I feel most deeply grateful to God and you, that I have enjoyed them for so long. And how hard it is for me to give them up and burn to ashes the hopes and future years, when, God willing, we might still have lived and loved together, and see our boys grown up to honorable manhood around us.*

*If I do not return, my dear Sarah, never forget how much I loved you, nor that when my last breath escapes me on the battle field, it will whisper your name... Forgive my many faults, and the many pains I have caused you. How thoughtless, how foolish I have sometimes been!... But, O Sarah, if the dead can come back to this earth and flit unseen around those they love, I shall always be with you, in the brightest day and in the darkest night... always, always. And when the soft breeze fans your cheek, it shall be my breath, or the cool air your throbbing temple, it shall be my spirit passing by.*

*Sarah do not mourn me dead; think I am gone and wait for me, for we shall meet again...*

There it is. When people willingly sacrifice their lives, they not only lay them down, but they also forfeit everything they're ever going to have in this life. We pray in gratitude for their sacrifice, but we also pray that the fullness of eternal bliss will be theirs, reunited with their loved ones with Christ in Heaven. **We will do this at all the Masses this weekend, and again in a special Mass on Monday at 9am at St. Philip Cemetery. In the event of rain, the Mass will be in St. Philip Church.**

We also want to honor their sacrifices so that they will not be in vain. Abraham Lincoln said in the Gettysburg Address, *"It is for us the living, rather, to be dedicated here to the unfinished work which they who fought here have thus far so nobly advanced. It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before us -- that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion -- that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain -- that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom -- and that government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth".*

Let us who are not in the armed forces do all we can, by living good, Christian lives, to ensure that the United States is one nation under God. Let us try to ensure that our national character does not continue to coarsen or focus on the ignoble, but become more refined and focus on the noble. Let us try to ensure that our God-given rights to religious liberty to practice our faith according to the dictates of our conscience is not taken away, and that the right to life for everyone from conception to natural death is restored. Our nation is not a perfect one, but I believe it is still, as Lincoln also said, "The last, best hope of mankind on earth". Let us keep hope alive, and restore and preserve our nations spiritual and moral health. One of the ways we can do this is to participate in this year's Fortnight for Freedom. 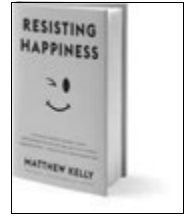

**New Message Series on *Resisting Happiness* Is Starting in June** As we have a couple of times before, we gave as a gift to folks who came to Mass on Easter one of Matthew Kelly's books. This time it was his latest (and perhaps his best so far), *Resisting Happiness*, in which Kelly describes the human tendency to resist true and lasting happiness by preferring our own ideas about what will make us happy to God's plan for our real fulfillment. Kelly has a marvelous way of presenting the fundamental and considerable means which our Catholic faith provides to overcome resistance, which Kelly defines as 'that sluggish feeling of not wanting to do something you know is good for you, it's the inclination to do something that you unabashedly know is *not* for you, and it's everything in between'.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

At the heart of our evangelizing mission is an invitation to a relationship with Jesus Christ which we extend as members of the Body of Christ. We are all commissioned by Baptism to share our love for Christ and his Church with those we meet in our workplace, in our communities and even in our own homes.



On the weekend of June 4th, our Diocese will take up a collection for the Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC). This collection helps bring the Gospel message to the public square so that all can know the love of God and help make this a better world. Pope Francis has reminded us that "communication has the power to build bridges, to enable encounter and inclusion, and thus to enrich society" (World Communications Day 2016).

For example, as people continue to access more and more information on mobile devices, there is an increased need to provide faith resources on these platforms as well. With your support of the CCC, the daily readings are available as free podcasts to download and listen to on the go, or to read from our diocesan and parish websites. In addition, the readings are also available in English and Spanish by email subscription. By supporting the CCC, people across the country are able to experience the Scriptures in a new way and are never far from the Word of God.

Roughly half of the funds collected will remain here in the Diocese to help with our local communications projects which are focused increasingly on expanding parish-centered communications in collaboration with diocesan programs. The remainder will fund national communications efforts as well as international projects in developing countries.
