12th Sunday in Ordinary Time



Dear friends,

Well, this is the last column I will write in the bulletin for you. That has such an air of finality to it, and—to me, at least—it puts sadness into my heart. The outpouring of love I have experienced over the last six years from you, and especially over the last few weeks since I shared the news that I'm leaving, has been unbelievable. The thought that it will end (will it?) makes me sad.

It also elicits a certain amount of fear—for us, regarding what life will be like once we're no longer in the same faith community, and for me, regarding what life will be like as Pastor of the huge St John Paul II Parish in Southbridge and Headmaster of the Catholic school Trinity Catholic Academy. Fortunately, in this Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus tells us to be not afraid because our Father in Heaven cares deeply for us, that not even a sparrow falls to the ground without his knowing about it, and that he is so deeply concerned with us that every hair on our head is counted. (Granted, this is not so hard a job with my head and hair than it was years ago!) In another place in the Gospel, Jesus says, "Fear is useless; what is needed is trust" (Mark 5:36).

Not only is it senseless to be afraid because God is always there to help us, but often we are afraid of something which does not in fact exist. It reminds me (of course) of a *Twilight Zone* episode called "The Fear". It involves a woman calling a police officer because she has seen strange lights in the sky. When the trooper gets there, more strange phenomena occur: the squad car mysteriously rolls away, crashes and is turned on its side. Later, it is found upright, but with huge fingerprints on it. After that, they see huge footprints in the woods. Finally they see a gigantic figure in a spacesuit towering over them. The trooper helps the woman fight her fear and urge to run away. Instead, they stand their ground, the trooper pulls his gun and shoots. There is a deafening hissing sound because the spaceman is just a huge balloon. The trooper and woman find behind the deflated balloon a small flying saucer with two miniscule aliens inside. Frightened at the two gigantic earthlings, and their ruse discovered, they fly away as fast as they can while the trooper and woman laugh.

What a great metaphor for the uselessness of fear, and how the Lord shrinks the monsters we create in our minds when we put our trust in Him. Rod Serling wrote the script for that episode, and he really put flesh on the old Christian saying, "Fear knocked, but when faith answered, nothing was there". And I can't help but remember that St John Paul II was constantly reminding us of Jesus' message to "Be not afraid!" I don't think it's a coincidence that I'm going to a parish named after the Saint who reminds us again that Jesus does not want us to fear.

It was a bit of a mistake to say before that we will no longer be part of the same faith community, for we will always be fellow disciples of Christ and members of His Body, the Church, wherever we are. And we will always be part of each other and in each other's hearts and souls. We can't share life and love the way we have for the past six years and not have that happen. We don't have to fear change, for the love we share will continue.

The way I will put it is not going to surprise anyone. I got in one last reference to classic TV with the *Twilight Zone* episode, and I won't pass up the last chance I have to use a classic popular song to drive home the point. With all due respect to Celine Dion, the singer, and James Horner and Will Jennings, the composers, I'm taking the liberty to tweak the lyrics to their best song "My Heart Will Go On" from the Academy Award-winning movie *Titanic*. Think of that tune and read below:

*Every day in my prayers, I'll keep you, I'll see you  
That is how I know we'll go on.  
Love can be shared six years and last for a lifetime  
And never let go though we're gone  
Near—far, wherever we are, we are here in our hearts  
And our hearts will go on.  
Near—far, wherever we are, we are here in God's heart  
And God's heart does go on and on.*

Thank you all for all your love, support, work, faith and every other gift for the last six years. In the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, our hearts will go on ....

**Fortnight for Freedom** — The Bishops in the United States have once again called us to pray a **Fortnight for Freedom** to ask God to continue to protect the religious liberty we enjoy in our country and to which all people have a God-given right. Recent court rulings and federal policies have eased off some threats to these rights, for example, companies and organizations do not have to offer medical coverage which pays for abortion-inducing drugs; medical professionals do not have to fear losing their jobs if they say no to participating in abortion procedures. However, we must always be vigilant in prayer and action, which is why the Fortnights continue. This year's started on Wednesday, June 21, and concludes on Tuesday, July 4. We are encouraged to pray every day, and the Bishops have provided the following **Prayer for Religious Liberty**:

*O God our Creator, from your provident hand we have received our right to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. You have called us as your people and given us the right and the duty to worship you, the only true God, and your Son, Jesus Christ. Through the power and working of your Holy Spirit, you call us to live out our faith in the midst of the world, bringing the light and the saving truth of the Gospel to every corner of society. We ask you to bless us in our vigilance for the gift of religious liberty. Give us the strength of mind and heart to readily defend our freedoms when they are threatened; give us courage in making our voices heard on behalf of the rights of your Church and the freedom of conscience of all people of faith. Grant, we pray, O heavenly Father, a clear and united voice to all your sons and daughters gathered in your Church in this decisive hour in the history of our nation, so that, with every trial withstood and every danger overcome—for the sake of our children, our grandchildren, and all who come after us—this great land will always be "one nation, under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.*
