Don't delay, how is God calling you to use your gifts today?

THE IMPORTANCE OF THE CATHOLIC FUNERAL MASS


Over the years as a priest I have celebrated many Catholic funerals. More and more I hear in eulogies about the deceased loved one now being an angel, looking down from heaven and smiling on their loved ones. Sadly a greater number of families are choosing to skip the funeral Mass altogether, sometimes for financial reasons, sometimes in the interest of a speedier funeral, or because they feel embarrassed to come to Church to attend Mass because it would make them feel too uncomfortable. How very sad!

Our Catholic Church, however, teaches us that our faith, and the faith of the deceased loved one and the faith of the whole Church community is far more important than our feelings when it comes to a Catholic funeral. Even though I may feel that I don't want to impose on my family, it is of utmost importance to have a funeral Mass or a Memorial Mass at a later date. For we firmly believe that the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass has infinite value because it is the re-enactment of Christ's own death out of love for us, and of His rising from the dead on Easter. In this Eucharist the Blessed Trinity, angels and saints are truly present. For Christ is truly present at this Mass.

Now Purgatory, as taught by the Church, is a process of purification that burns any speck of selfishness that may be in us at the time of our death or any imperfection in us so that we can be totally transformed by God's immense Love. As one holy man that I know said to me a few years ago: "Father, when I die, I hope I will go to purgatory because I know my love for God is not pure enough. And that is what I most desire."

Therefore, the most valuable thing we can do for our loved ones who have died is to offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, which is Christ's offering of his life by dying on the cross for us. More valuable than any monetary gift to our loved one's favorite charity is the Holy Eucharist.

Please tell your family and even consider putting it in writing that the most important request you have about your own funeral is the funeral Mass. The best way your family and friends can honor you is to grant your request. This is central to our Catholic faith.


CHRISTMAS ADOPT-A-FAMILY
